A reading from Hebrews.

²⁹ By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. ³⁰ By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹ By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace. ³² And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the ³³ who through faith conquered kingdoms, prophets. administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴ quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. 35 Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶ Others suffered mocking and flogging and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷ They were stoned to death; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented

of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains and in caves and holes in the ground.

39 Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, 40 since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect. 12:1 Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, 2 looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne



Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word

Zion is collecting supplies needed by Edison school which is where the neighborhood children will be attending in the fall. There is a tote at the back of the sanctuary where you can put these items. We will be collecting them through August 24th.

Things needed: disinfecting wipes, tissues, gallon sized ziploc bags, Sturdy drawstring backpacks for field trips, snack sized ziploc bags, kid -friendly birthday cards so each child can receive a card for their birthday from their school family.

They are also hoping to collect the following items for families in need: Toilet paper, all-purpose cleaners like Fabuloso or Mr. Clean, Laundry supplies, shampoo, Conditioner, Deodorant /anti-perspirant, Twin sized sheets and blankets, Children's socks, Children's underwear, Gently used children's jackets and coats and reusable water bottles.
