Minutes of the Council Meeting of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church

Monday, March 18, 2024

Approval of Agenda: motion made and approved

Approval of Minutes: motion made and approved.

Committee Reports reviewed from:

Administrators: Karen discussed working with Lambert Accounting. Also mentioned that accounts previously at a bank were now at Community First Credit Union.

Also, an account was opened for the Affordable Housing Project.

2 bids were received for the lifts-\$42k-\$43k to replace the lift in the sanctuary and \$25k for the lift by the chapel. The funds for this can be taken from the Building/ Roof Repair funds.

Karen has been talking with some non-profits about renting the parsonage A.B.C. A Better Chand and New Voices choir for some office space. A future appt. will be set up to have Pillars tour as well.

Because of the switch over to Lamberts, the Pastors checks will be mailed out to them.

Property: Gary N. spoke about the lifts and said we need to replace the one in the sanctuary because they don't have the part for them anymore. However, he can likely repair the lift by the chapel with parts from the sanctuary lift.

Worship and Music: All is set for Good Friday services. The set up for Palm Sunday Brunch will be at 10 am on Saturday.

Zion Mutual Homes: no report

Finance: Report was motioned and approved.Call Committee: No progress yet on any interested pastors. We are good for several weeks with supply pastors for Sundays.

Old Business: Bonnie discussed the Affordable Housing Project the parsonage would be the first place to start acquiring an income by renting it out. The city can do an inspection for free for lead and possible asbestos. If nothing is torn up in a remodel we don't have to worry about asbestos. That is only if things (floor tiles, etc.) are disturbed.

New Business: We need to contact a plaster company to fix an area in the kitchen where a leak was per Gwen. We used Remus in the past, but they are a bit busy, we might need to look elsewhere to get this done in a timely manner.

Motion was made and passed to have Karen contact the City of Appleton to do an inspection of the Parsonage with the Property Committee present.

Current Zoning for the Parsonage supports renting to non-profits, with one or multiple. Supportive housing for 4 individuals – either Pillars or ABC.

As previously mentioned, Karen will contact different organizations.

Bonnie to contact Shannon French, Architect about doing an initial rezoning of what developing the empty lot by Zion place could look like.

Could have development committee look for grants to cover Shannon's pay for further renderings such as the '62 and '29 buildings.

Important information:

- -Kandie Wilz has graciously volunteered to lead the Good Futures Program, a seven week course assisting congregations in walking through their Mission, Vision and desires for their property.
- -Zion Church Council Meeting April 15, 2024. Bonnie and Jason Schulist were available to answer questions about the final report from GLCI. Bonnie reviewed the Executive Summary and laid out four main choice points for the Council and Zion congregation to consider
 - 1. Becoming the Developer for this project or partnering with a Developer
 - 2. Preparing to manage the housing units to be rented/leased/sold or hiring a management company to do so
 - 3. Sell off portions of the property for development
 - 4. Electing to hold off doing any of these and see what happens

City Inspector came to give code update implications on April 25, 2024.
