A Message from the Zion Lutheran Council President:

March is a season that arrives either with cold, roaring winds like a lion or with warm, gentle breezes like a lamb, but March is also the season of the Lent, the Christian's season for repentance and reflection.

Zion has been through much since the beginning of the year. Thankfully our annual meeting went well. The Council said goodbye to Carl Abendroth who faithfully served two terms. Tom Meltz was welcomed as the new member of the church council. Thanks, Tommy, for stepping forward. We also have the services of Karen Farlow as our church administrator who handles the day-to-day operation of the church. She is supported by our church office administrator, Kimberly Gordon, our maintenance engineer, Elliot Pegel and a group dedicated volunteers. All their hard work is deeply appreciated.

While the search continues for a part-time pastor or at least an interim, (Please keep our call committee in your prayers) our worship has been led by supply pastors, introducing us to different preaching styles. Heather Watney, Cheryl Meyer and Paula Staedt have insured beautiful music enhances our worship.

As mentioned, Lent is a time for repentance, giving us a chance to atone for sins of both commission and omission. For example, at a recent Council meeting a long-time member addressed us about the church's failure to properly acknowledge the passing of his wife. It should not have happened, and we must make sure no member experiences the same. Apology and repentance.

The time of reflection is needed to determine the course Zion will follow into the future. The Affordable Housing project moves ahead, perhaps not as quickly as some would prefer, but we need to proceed with care. We are awaiting the results of the asbestos revue report, as well as the GLCI report indicating what the congregation and the neighborhood would like to see developed here. As one of our guest pastors reminded us, a community of faith needs to be bold, not timid for we are God's people who trust where he leads us.

March this year means we will celebrate Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the glory of Easter, all at our regular Holy Week services in one month. However, this year Zion will host the noon ecumenical service, an opportunity to showcase our beautiful sanctuary. Heather Watney and Cheryl Meyer are working with Pastor Ryan from First English to provide a meaningful worship experience to the Appleton community. It is amazing what we can do when we work together.

It is wonderful to see the "Help the Homeless" box filling up through the generosity of Zion members just as we keep the blessing box full. We much remember that our neighbors are not just those who live next door but also those who have no permanent address. Jesus and his disciples would be classified as "homeless" (What you do to the least of these, you do unto me).

Before March leaves us either as a lion or a lamb, we can rest assured that God has a plan for Zion. Just as Mary did not recognize the risen Christ at the tomb, we presently can't quite recognize what that plan for us is, we need to move forward, bold in our faith. Easter gave us God's greatest gift in the resurrection of His Son. Let us Rise as well. Hallelujah, hallelujah!

Raise Right Fundraising

Raise Right. What is it? It is a fundraising program where you purchase gift cards. Who doesn't need a gift card for something. Here is how it works. It has been predetermined how much less Zion would pay for each retailer gift card on the list. When anyone orders a gift card from a retailer, they pay the actual amount of the gift card but when Zion pays Raise Right, they subtract the predetermined percentage & that is what Zion pays. The difference is what Zion keeps. They do charge a shipping fee so when an order is placed, I need to make sure the savings Zion gets covers the cost of shipping. It usually takes about 2-3 days after ordering the gift cards to get them, so the turnaround is fast. I am hoping to have some gift cards on hand so you could get one right away. There is a list of all the gift cards available at church in the narthex. If you would like to receive the list of all retailers & can't get to church, please contact me & I can either email it to you or send it to you in the mail. If you have any other questions or would like to order any gift cards please contact me. Remember gift cards can be used for gifts, projects or for your everyday use. Thank you to anyone who has purchased them in the past & I hope many more will decide to purchase them in the future.

February Updates Affordable Housing Project

February Meetings held included February 12th Development Team Meeting, February 19th Roundtable Meeting, February 21st Neighborhood Advisory Team Meeting, and February 26th Planning Team Meeting.

Jenny Krikava, Community Engagement Manager for the Community Foundation of the Fox Valley Region and Bonnie were interviewed by Nathan Phelps from Spectrum News about the Project. Bonnie and Kandie Wilz attended the Housing Justice and Congregational Futures Conference in Wausau. Bonnie also received a call from Luanne Ferguson from the ELCA Mission Investment Fund who had heard about our Project through staff of the East Central ELCA Synod who suggested she contact us. It was a great conversation about our Project and how the Mission Investment Fund can be a resource for funding.

Bonnie, Karen Farlow, Sue Bunkert and Tammy Mossholder met with Dave and Dustin from NorthStar Environmental Testing to review the Zion buildings and provide quotes for an assessment of both lead and asbestos issues which will factor into our planning for the affordable housing project.

Bonnie and Kandie Wila attended a free community organizing training in Green Bay hosted by JOSHUA, WISDOM and ESTHER. They learned a great deal about building a community with purpose for social justice.

Bonnie was invited to participate in a zoom call with Pastor Peter Beeson from St. John's Lutheran Church in Madison which is building a 10- story building to house their church and many floors of affordable housing.

Interest has been expressed in having Bonnie purchase the Good Futures Accelerator Course, which offers faith communities a faith-based program for deciding Mission, Vision, and Outcome for church property. Sue suggested doing the course during Fellowship time after Sunday Services.

Julie Filapek from NeighborWorks Green Bay facilitated a small group of us in touring a neighborhood of NeighborWorks properties including single family homes, townhouses and other renovations. They talked about the importance of Mission in shaping our Project and having a common vision for what is being created. Zion's Mission Statement is "Creating Community through God's Love and Guidance", and the vision should be coming into much clearer focus shortly given what is slated to unfold.
