Raise Right Fundraising

Raise Right. What is it? It is a fundraising program where you purchase gift cards. Who doesn't need a gift card for something. Here is how it works. It has been predetermined how much less Zion would pay for each retailer gift card on the list. When anyone orders a gift card from a retailer, they pay the actual amount of the gift card but when Zion pays Raise Right, they subtract the predetermined percentage & that is what Zion pays. The difference is what Zion keeps. They do charge a shipping fee so when an order is placed, I need to make sure the savings Zion gets covers the cost of shipping. It usually takes about 2-3 days after ordering the gift cards to get them, so the turnaround is fast. I am hoping to have some gift cards on hand so you could get one right away. There is a list of all the gift cards available at church in the narthex. If you would like to receive the list of all retailers & can't get to church, please contact me & I can either email it to you or send it to you in the mail. If you have any other questions or would like to order any gift cards please contact me. Remember gift cards can be used for gifts, projects or for your everyday use. Thank you to anyone who has purchased them in the past & I hope many more will decide to purchase them in the future.

Affordable Housing Project Update April 2024

Bonnie received notice from Cheryl Meyer, the Choir Director at Zion, that the Affordable Housing Project would be the recipient of the Good Friday Ecumenical service offering on March 29th. Bonnie spoke to pastor Ben Morris from Emmanuel United Methodist Church and shared an overview of the Affordable Housing Project with him as he will be talking about it at the services.

The Good Futures Accelerator Course to guide Zion congregation members through a faith-based process of making decisions about their Mission and their property has arrived.

Bonnie attended a Zoom hosted by Harriet Redman who started Special Needs Housing to address the difficulties families face finding suitable housing for their loved ones with special needs.

On Monday, March 11, 2024, Generative Local Community Institute (GLCI) hosted a feedback session to present their feedback and recommendations regarding the Affordable Housing Project. GLCI proposed Zion develop a plan that would generate \$15,000 in monthly income from use of its campus. The five key areas to be addressed are; Parish House (parsonage), the empty lot on the southeast corner of the southern block of Zion campus, Zion Mutual Homes, the empty lot on the northern block of the Zion campus and the combined school buildings. Next steps include Zion making a decision about whether to go with the model that's exclusively housing or the model that is housing and small businesses and Zion granting permission for the Development team to pursue funding solar panels on Zion Mutual Homes. Bonnie and JD Gildemeister met with Jon Searles from WHEDA to learn more about what WHEDA has to offer in terms of funding for our project.

Bonnie and Kandie Wilz were part of a group that toured the Gateway Collective project being built in Green Bay.

Zion Church Council met on Monday, March 18th, and made decisions related to getting the Parish House rented out. Karen Farlow will be contacting the City of Appleton to have a free assessment of the building prior to renting it out. Bonnie was tasked with reaching out to local architect for initial assessments and drawings for the project. Bonnie met with Shannon French and gave him a tour of the available property. Shannon French submitted a proposal for conceptual design for the entire Zion property, breaking it down into the various parcels. Funds for Mr. French's work will be coming from one of the two grants we currently have in place.

There was a roundtable meeting, Development Team meeting, Neighborhood Advisory Team meeting, Ad Hoc Team meeting and Planning Team meeting. The Neighborhood Advisory Team offered to go door-to-door to neighbors to talk about the project and asked the Planning team to create talking points for them to have uniformity of information being shared.
