

Announcement from Zion's Administrator, Wendy Sachs:

Zion Lutheran Church was hit by lightning on Saturday, August 16, 2025. Zion Mutual Homes was also affected. Some of the impacts have been corrected and others are still being addressed. Two of the impacts you may experience are the lack of a full sanctuary sound system and no online worship. We are waiting to coordinate an electrical system shutdown and test with Faith Technologies and WE Energies. Once we have an understanding of how the lightning strike effected the electrical system at Zion, we can begin repairs. More news to come as details are known.

Stewardship Notes: Generosity Time
